No Citizen Comments

Staff Reports:**Aquatic & Fitness Programmer:**

Oas presented the Board with objectives, goals, and an implementation timeline. Oas stated that the future programming plan expands both the number of programs in aquatics and fitness. Part time staffing is also still a need in the front desk and fitness instructor area.

Parks & Recreation Director:

Amundson stated the Field of Dreams Concession/Restroom Building has come a long way and is set to open Monday, May 23rd for the first day of service. Amundson gave kudos to all involved for making it happen.

Wayfinding Signs & Trash/Recycle Bins: The new trash and recycle bins have been installed at Starin Park and look fantastic. The wayfinding signs have come in and will be put in place the week of May 23rd.

Cravath Lakefront Fence: Chuck Nass has met with the Rail Road Company multiple times and has come to the conclusion that we will not be required to put up extra gates. The project is now set to move forward and bids will be sent out shortly.

Considerations:**Presentation by Brett Sackett of Thysee Printing & Design related to branding and logo development for the Parks and Recreation Department**

Brett Sackett of Thysee Printing & Design presented the board a booklet of the current logo and proposed logo. Brett explained the importance of branding, logo's, and why now is a good time to create a brand for Parks & Recreation or the entire City. Sackett also commented that the proposed logo is set in four color, which would allow easy printing and usage in the future.

Amundson stated that the cost of replacing the logo placed in the park signs would not be significant and approximately \$3,000. Knedler suggested that a unified City Logo would be the best, but if we select to only work on a Parks and Recreation logo, we should consider something other than the Train Depot. Grady suggested thinking about "What is Whitewater", and are there other options that represent Whitewater.

The Board directed Amundson to take the concerns and suggestions back to the City Manager and seek suggestion on Brett attending a City Council meeting to make same presentation and answer questions.

Presentation by Chuck Nahn of Nahn & Associates related to the dredging feasibility study of Cravath and Trippe Lake.

Amundson introduced the project and commented that this project has been approved by the Parks and Recreation Board and Common Council. Chuck Nahn presented to the board information regarding both Cravath and Trippe Lake and the process of dredging.

Nahn handed out maps of each lake and asked for feedback on the following areas:

- Where they would like to see selective dredging occur in both lakes
- Input on any potential dredging spoil disposal areas
- Past history of industrial activity around the lakes
- Walk through the major activities for the dredging feasibility study

Members of the board helped Nahn with information in each of these areas, which will help the project move forward.

Discussion and possible action on plans proposed by the Urban Forestry Commission for Minneiska Park and Walton Oaks Park.

Amundson introduced the possible plantings for Minneiska Park and that Walton Oaks park will be delayed due to Karen Coburn falling ill and unable to attend the meeting. The possible planting plan for Minneiska stated “Knowing that a playground is to be installed, it would be important to plant canopy/shade trees as soon as possible. Handicap access is another concern for the exact placement of these trees. Chuck Nass, City Forester, plans to begin planting in the spring of 2017. He suggested White Oak and Sugar Maples as native species that would be supportive to insects and birds. Chuck was also agreeable to planting willow trees near the upper detention pond and native trees, possibly flowering, and bushes in other appropriate areas within the park”.

Knedler moved to accept the written plan with final approval to happen when the UFC brings back the exact planting placement GIS map of Minneiska Park . Second by Oberle. Ayes: Nate Jaeger, Bruce Parker, Brandon Knedler, Steve Ryan, Chris Grady, Larry Kachel, and Kori Oberle. Noes: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Jen Kaina, Rachel Deporter, and Ken Kidd.

Discussion and possible action related to the Whitewater Aquatic Center Operations Manual

Amundson introduced Debbi Oas and the topic of the Aquatic Center Operations Manual, which continues to be a work in progress. Oas also presented the board with the programming plan, objectives, and future implementation plan. Amundson and Oas asked for feedback from the board in the following areas:

1. Membership
 - a. What is included?
 - b. Discount for programs offered?
 - c. Towel service?
 - d. Seniors – what age is considered a Senior (currently age 65)
 - e. Cost of card replacement (currently \$15)
 - f. Punch cards-10 visits (\$60 resident, \$70 non-resident)
2. Facility Operation Hours
 - a. Is there a need to provide expanded hours?
3. Contracted Cleaning Service
 - a. Currently Monday evenings – do we need to expand?
4. General Pool Rules
 - a. Age of child allowed in pool without adult supervision (currently 10)
 - b. Severe Weather & Lightning – open or close

A board discussion took place between staff and board members which included; looking for creative ways for towel replacement, keeping the card replacement cost the same, creating and sending a survey to current members asking about facility operation times, contacting the current cleaning company and asking for pricing on additional cleaning services, and the importance of keeping participants safe during severe weather, while also following all state rules and laws.

Kachel suggested to the board that a subcommittee be created to tackle all Aquatic Center Items to minimize the length of each month Parks and Recreation Board meeting for the next few months.

Amundson thanked the board for the feedback and will be bringing the manual back to future meetings.

Amundson expressed the desire to establish a consistent meeting schedule until April 2014

Discussion and possible action related to the Whitewater Aquatic Center Operations Manual

Amundson introduced the manual as a working document and invited Debbie Oas to explain the manual and ask the boards opinion on needed subjects.

Larry Kachel arrives at 5:35pm

Oas asked the board suggestions on a Inclement Weather Policy. Amundson suggested the facility be open as much as possible but making sure safety is the number one concern. Ryan suggested using staff within a certain mileage from the facility on inclement weather days. Jaeger suggested not tying any policy to the school district decisions. The board suggested keeping the facility open as much as possible, but leave program cancelations due to inclement weather at the digression of staff.

Oas asked the board suggestion on changing the word “member” to possibly; patrons, yearly pass holders, or customers. The board agreed with the changing of the word “member” and directed Oas to select the best fit word.

Knedler moved to accept the Whitewater Aquatic Center Operations Manual with the noted changes, review from the City Attorney, and that the manual will return monthly to the board for review and suggestions. Lynn Binnie summarizes the main issues with the Lock Box Ordinance and the reason for the Lock Box Committee. Currently to date an estimated 102 business owners have not complied with the Lock Box Ordinance. The council believes non-compliance is possibly due to several factors:

- a. Lack of educating business owners
- b. The amount of businesses and types of businesses which are responsible for installing lock boxes was too large of a pool. Committee would like to revisit types of entities required to have lock boxes.
- c. Access and security of lock box master keys

Due to Cameron Clapper, City Manager, having to leave at 6:00 pm, L. Binnie requests the committee to start with item 3 on the agenda (Review of policies regarding access to lock boxes) so the City Manager can express his view on the situation.

- L. Binnie and W. McDonell will amend the wording to the Lock Box Ordinance based on the meeting suggestions and present again to the committee in June. Ordinance must be ready by the 5th of July. Draft to be circulated by June 17. Jim Allen motions to allow L. Binnie and W. McDonell to draft an amended ordinance, P. Wellnitz seconds, Approved, All-0.
- L. Binnie final comment: Police will still have access to the lock box keys. The Fire and Police Department members will get together to establish agreed upon policy and procedures for use, security of keys and an audit trail for use of keys. Deadline set for June 17th for a draft of the policy and procedures.

3. Review of policies regarding access to the lock boxes.

Clapper summarizes the different point of views:

- A. Only fire personnel should have access as to prevent responders without proper training possibly endangering themselves or citizens.
 - B. EMS Calls-1st Responders: Police are not officially trained “First Responders” but do have policies in place stating police will respond to rescue calls for services and provide First Aid and CPR to citizens in need. Police should have access to the lock box keys.
- After careful review of emails received from Asst. Chief Weidert and Asst. Chief Gabbey as well as information from Chief Lisa Otterbacher, C. Clapper recommends when talking of first response for rescue calls the current wording of the ordinance should include “all public safety personnel” have access to the keys. When talking about fires, the city manager recommends a discussion take place between police and fire personnel to ensure all those with issues regarding fire response access reach a mutual agreement as he feels there is some procedure which could be implemented to include access to all public safety personnel while ensuring during an actual fire call that only those trained are responding in whatever fashion to ensure a safe scene and the job is getting done to keep people safe. C. Clapper would like to see the committee make his suggestion as city manager workable with the group of capable people present representing both sides.
 - L. Binnie asks the fire department to respond first. Christ Christon emphasizes that everyone has the same goal in mind to do what is best for the community and safety of citizens, but at the end of the day it’s state law and city ordinance which allows the fire department to make the final decision. Chief Gregoire also notes the fire department signed an agreement allowing them ownership of the lock box master key.
 - Chief Gregoire summarizes a call for service where upon arrival smoke was present in an apartment building but when Fire Department personnel arrived on scene all the police personnel who had arrived ahead of them removed all 3 sets of keys from the lock box thus leaving fire personnel locked outside with no access. Also the fire alarm was not pulled, per Fire Department protocol, immediately upon entry. The fire personnel were eventually able to find someone in the parking lot to let them in. This same type of incident also occurred a month earlier on Prince Street where the police personnel inside the structure had the keys and are not proper trained fire responders and the fire department personnel were locked outside of the building again. More examples are shared regarding issues with police personnel having access to the lock box keys.
 - Approximately 400 lock boxes are installed in the city with only 102 boxes left to be installed. FD member suggests it may be easier to just sell the boxes straight out and eliminate a city ordinance. Fire Department inspectors already have the authority to issue tickets without the ordinance. W. McDonell reminds the Fire Department they asked for a city ordinance and were offered help from the city with the assistance of Chris Munz-Pritchard.
 - Capt Meyer reminds the committee; even though police officers have access to the keys does not diminish their rights in regards to search and seizure. The police department also has a General Order established already in regards to search and seizure protocol. Capt. Meyer offers to pass a copy around to anyone wishing to review. W. McDonell explains that the

current ordinance is written for the Fire Department Personnel to have access to the keys and when police respond first and take keys this could leave an argument open for citizens to challenge in court. Capt Meyer points out in their protocol when the police department has an active search and seizure warrant they will enter the premise by either the lock box key which will save damage to the property owner or they will force entry, but the warrant will be served. W. McDonell reiterates that Jim Allen would like to see protocol worked out between the fire and police departments as mentioned earlier. Fire Department wants to know who will be liable for standing by damaged property if forced entry is used.

- Discussion continues with making some businesses exempt, if so the list would drop down to roughly 58 businesses left to install lock boxes. Suggested exempt businesses which are being proposed: churches stand alone structures and small businesses. P. Wellnitz is concerned about churches being exempt because of most of the churches contain halls, kitchens, community rooms and may use extension cords. L. Binnie recommends enforcing the ordinance on non-residential buildings where the premise on non-residential buildings with a monitored fire alarm and/or sprinkler system or an external audible fire or burglar alarm, any building which is not entirely residential with a common wall/walls with units in the building or with another building, multi-family structures (same way listed), nursing homes, public or private schools, government buildings, and any place which stores hazardous chemicals. L. Binnie would like to see churches exempt. He feels if the committee presented to council the above mentioned list council would probably accept the recommendation.
- Fire Department agrees with L. Binnie and would like to amend the ordinance as suggested by L. Binnie and continuing to hold off on fines at this time. P. Wellnitz wants to amend the ordinance so that public understands all public safety personnel will have access to the lock box keys. Police and Fire Departments agree they can work together on setting up protocol or procedures to follow for the lock box key usage.
- The issue of churches being exempt from the ordinance as recommended by L. Binnie is discussed further to explain how places of worship are popping up in many different types of locations. Fire Department recommends if the council chooses to exempt places of worship that the code will supersede an exemption. This means if a place of worship is located inside a commercial building, which would require a lock box, then the code will be enforced and a lock box must be installed. W. McDonell suggests putting in language to the ordinance where a lock box is required but then adds language in the ordinance allowing the Chief to make exemptions.
- L. Binnie summarizes the group is moving towards amending the ordinance along the general guidelines of what we have here so far (Referring to Mike Higgins list). P. Wellnitz suggests wording to explain the lock box keys are only for when an emergency is called for service and not just for random entry in every situation. Wally recommends “public safety personnel” is added into the ordinance to encompass public safety personnel and not just fire department personnel as most emergency responses require both police and fire department members. Police already has very specific procedures in place for use as well as disciplinary procedures are set for misuse of the keys. Fire department at this time does not have a procedure set for use or misuse of the keys, but is currently working on one.

- Is there an audit procedure for when and where the keys are used for the last 6 months?
Police and Fire Department do not have a policy at this time for recording use of the keys. Fire department will include on all reports if a lock box key was used. PD has a secure location for the key where each sworn officer is aware of the location and how to access. Ordinance will state or be amended so there is a specific use and tracking of the keys.

Minutes

1. Roll Call

Meeting called to order by L. Binnie at 5:30 pm.

Present: Cameron Clapper, Lynn Binnie, Patrick Wellnitz, Wally McDonell and Jim Allen. Also present: Capt. Dan Meyer, Chief Don Gregoire, Joe Uselding and Mike Higgins.

2. Approval of Minutes from meeting May 12, 2016.

Motion to approve minutes by Jim Allen, second by Patrick Wellnitz, approved, All-0.

3. Review of draft policy and procedure for Fire/Police Department members regarding entry into fire alarms/calls and security /use of lock boxes.

- A. Capt. Meyer gives a brief overview of meeting with Fire Department and Police Department members which took place earlier in June. 3 different situations were discussed when Police Officers would possibly be responding where use of the lock box maybe necessary. The fire department was able to give proper responses needed, so the police department supervisors could set up training for the officers and the response protocol will be uniform throughout the department.
- B. L. Binnie points out some hand writing on document which states police department members will not enter any apartment if smoke is showing whatsoever. Lt Meyer verifies this and also notes this is also correct for residential homes.
- C. Chief Gregoire explains that Fire/EMS/Police were in agreement with recommending that the Council approve the purchase of a Knox KeySecure Key Retention boxes for each vehicle. This would maintain tracking for all used of keys and heighten the security for citizens. This retention system, Knox Keysecure Master Key Retention, is able to be downloaded to all squads so everyone will have access for one price.
- D. The System provides a self-contained retention system of the Knox Box master key and the key will be released by entering an authorized PIN into the keypad. The system can hold up to 5000 pins for access so each individual user will have their own pin. Hot spots would also be added into the fire and police department by Tim Nobling. The system has a 5 year battery life and logs the date/time and Pin # identity anytime the key is accessed and returned.

- E. The cost of the system is approximately \$19,184 which the committee is recommending be incurred through the city contingency funds.
 - F. Binnie questions what happens if one of the keys is lost. What will need to be done to rekey all the lock boxes? Higgins will check into the cost. If the police department members lose a key, the cost to replace will fall on the police department. Allen questions what will happen to the individual who loses, misplaces or takes a key. Discussion ensues and a determination will be made on a case-by-case basis depending on the situation. Clapper confirms if the key was lost by negligence there would be internal discussions with the individual and disciplinary actions. If the key is intentionally hidden or taken, termination would be a possible outcome.
 - G. Agreement is reached that a policy will be implemented to handle lost/damaged or stolen keys.
 - H. Allen motions to recommend to the Council the purchase of the Knox Keysecure Master Key Retention System with the addition of a policy to specify what will happen to an individual/employee when the keys are lost/damaged or stolen. Wellnitz seconds. Motion passed. All-0.
4. **Review proposed amendments to Lock Box Ordinance and make recommendations to Common Council.**
- A. W. McDonell summarizes changes to the proposed Lock Box Ordinance.
 - B. 14.15.010: Whitewater Fire Department will be listed as Whitewater Fire Department Inc.
 - C. Ordinance clarifies that the Whitewater Fire Department Inc. and the City of Whitewater Police Department will both have access to the Knox Box keys.
 - D. Ordinance specifies that all buildings where a fire detection or suppression system is monitored by an alarm company or has an external audible or fire alarm will be required to have a lock box.
 - E. The general requirement for all industrial or commercial buildings and multi-family building was replaced. Commercial buildings that have a common wall between units in the building or a common wall with another building will be required to have the lock box system. Multi-Family structures comprised of three or more units in which access to the building or common area or mechanical/electrical rooms within the building is denied through locked doors will need to have the lock box system.
 - F. Other structures required to have the Lock Box System installed:
 - i. Schools, whether public or private
 - ii. Nursing homes, Community Based Residential Facilities, and Residential Care Apartment Complexes.
 - iii. Business Park Buildings

- iv. Municipal buildings/University Buildings and locked gates leading to building(s) are required to have lock box installed.
 - v. Buildings with occupants required to prepare hazardous chemical inventory forms under the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA).
 - vi. All new commercial structures with building permits that were issued from date of ordinance amendment.
 - vii. All commercial structures with remodeling permits that were issued from the date of ordinance amendment.
- G. Contents of Lock Box now included that a master key is required for all multi-family buildings which wasn't included before.
- H. Security of Lock Box Access of Keys will now state "No personnel shall carry a lock box key except while carrying out an authorized use." All lock box keys shall be secured in a lock box in City or Fire Department vehicles. Also the fire department and police department will maintain a record documenting all uses of lock boxes.
- I. Exceptions to Requirement to Install a Key Lock Box System: no major changes were implemented just some rewording of the existing language.
- J. Option to Opt Out of Key Lock Box System: Requirement was removed completely.
- K. 14.15.010 Declaration of Purpose: City of Whitewater Fire Department shall be changed to Whitewater Fire Department Inc. and "other City of Whitewater public safety personnel" will be removed. Language should only reflect Whitewater Fire Department and City of Whitewater Police Department.
- L. 14.15.020: Wellnitz recommends the language shall be changed from "any building where a fire detection or suppression system installed is monitored by an alarm company" to "any building with a fire detection or suppression system installed." Binnie points out the original wording was to clarify single family residence and duplexes are excluded. W. McDonell will rework the wording to exclude single family and duplexes unless their system is monitored by an alarm company. Monitored meaning Whitewater Fire Department Inc or City of Whitewater Police Department are called and dispatched to a call.
- M. 14.15.020(A) (13): Committee moves into a discussion about item A13 regarding the 60 minute wait time period with no response from a keyholder and the ability to gain access. Committee agrees to remove this item entirely.
- N. Add item to 14.15.020, (A14), to state all commercial structures in the downtown area will need to have lock box. Wellnitz wants the Downtown area defined geographically. C. Clapper and Fire Department member will work together to set the geographical area.
- O. Add item to 14.15.020(A15), all non-residential buildings with cooking facilities.

- P. Add item to 14.15.020(A16), all buildings where acetylene or similar torches are used.
 - Q. Add item to 14.15.020(A17), all buildings which require OSHA “Hot Permit”
 - R. 14.15.030(E) Delete current 14.15. 030(E) regarding the window decal. New 14.15.030 add “his or her designee” besides the Fire Chief.
 - S. 14.15.070(E) Delete the last sentence “There must be at least one (1) key lock box for every (4) buildings and the key in the lock must be able to open all of the residential buildings on site.
 - T. 14.15.080: Add this provision will be enforced as of January, 1, 2017.
 - U. Clapper directs the committee back to 14.15.010 and a determination is made to soften the wording regarding “other legal purposes”.
 - V. Motion to move recommended changes as discussed tonight to council on the Lock Box Ordinance is made by Allen, Second by Wellnitz, motion passes, All-0.
5. **Discuss next meeting date if needed**
Draft will be sent out for everyone to review by July 15th. Finalize by July 25, 2016. If anyone still feels the need to have a meeting after reviewing changes they should contact L. Binnie.

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ASSISTANT DIRECTOR'S REPORT

3 people attended the Adulting 101: Car Maintenance class held on May 9th. Sheldon Newkirk from Blackhawk Technical College did an excellent job of leading the class, and took the students outside for a hands-on lesson with a vehicle. The handout he provided for the class was very detailed, and will continue to be useful for them in the future.

This month Maker Monday was held on May 16th and was all about the birds! We made two different types of birdfeeders, complete with birdseed, so they were ready to take home and hang up. One of the attendees was from Elkhorn and asked if she could share the class idea with her home library. I thought this was a nice compliment to our library and our programs.

The "Music of Star Wars: A Celebration of John Williams' Movie" program held on May 17th, was well attended by 22 patrons of all ages. Aaron Krerowicz, Beatles scholar and author, showcased the music of all seven movies, citing historical precedents and comparing musical influences with the twofold purpose of (1) illustrating how the music developed, and (2) enlightening listening and furthering enjoyment of the music. This was the second time Aaron has presented at our library.

Deana and I had 9 people attend the Bee Hotel workshop on Saturday, May 21st. Everyone in attendance made a bee hotel for themselves, and a bee hotel for the library. Since the PVC pipe we used was white, we brought out the colorful Duck and Washi tape which made the project more creative and colorful. We purchased the PVC from Home Depot, and they were kind enough to cut each piece into thirds, at no cost to us. That was a big time saver for us.

The I Am Jazz reading on May 23rd was a great success. There were 70 people in attendance and everyone was very respectful. The students who did the reading did a great job! The community was thankful that the library was willing to provide space for

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this event. The two banners that the youth created to promote “Close the Book on Hate” are hanging in and outside of the Whitewater Room. I proctored two online Math exams for UW Whitewater students during the month of May. Our experience at BookExpo in Chicago was just wonderful! It was such an excellent event for librarians to attend. I hope to one day have the opportunity to attend BookExpo again.

YOUTH EDUCATIONAL SERVICES REPORT

I Am Jazz Event

The public reading of *I Am Jazz* was a success! We had over 70 people in attendance. The children and teens who attended created two *Close the Book on Hate* banners that are currently on display in the Whitewater Room for LGBTQ Pride Month.

Elementary School Visits

Cory Pepler was able to arrange for me to visit all three elementary schools in the Whitewater Unified School District in order to promote the summer reading program. During the visit I read *Ragweed's Farm Dog Handbook* to the younger classes, explained the reading logs, and talked about the programs and prizes.

Teen Volunteer Training

We currently have 9 individuals registered to participate in our summer volunteer program. Volunteers have been trained to work the registration table, will assist with program prep, and some will participate in our Read-with-Me program and will be reading to our birth-3 year olds.

Summer Reading Program Registration

We had 150 children and teens register for the summer reading program during registration week alone. Participants may continue to register until the final week of the program. Last year, we had 231 participants total. We are on target to increase our numbers this year. The school visits were instrumental in this increase.

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ORDINANCE No. _____
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF WHITEWATER KEY LOCK BOX ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Whitewater, Walworth and Jefferson Counties, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Whitewater Municipal Code Chapter 14.15 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14.15.010	Declaration of Purpose
14.15.020	Key Lock Box System
14.15.030	Installation
14.15.040	Maintenance
14.15.050	Contents of Lock Box
14.15.060	Security of Lock Box Access Keys
14.15.070	Exceptions to Requirement to Install a Key Lock Box System
14.15.080	Penalties
14.15.090	Invalid Provisions

14.15.010 Declaration of Purpose.

- A. The City of Whitewater, Wisconsin Common Council hereby determines that the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Whitewater, Wisconsin are promoted and safeguarded by requiring certain structures to have a key lock box installed on the exterior of the structure to aid the Whitewater Fire Department Inc. and City of Whitewater Police Department to gain access to the structure when the same is not occupied, when the occupants are unable to grant ingress and for other legal purposes. However, this ordinance shall not grant Whitewater Fire Department Inc. or the City of Whitewater Police Department a greater right to enter into any building than what would be legally allowed without this ordinance.
- B. The key lock box system will reduce the need for forced entry into structures and should avoid costly and time-consuming efforts in gaining access to locked structures during an emergency.
- C. This chapter will provide for a method for rapid response entry into and throughout locked buildings in emergency situations where time may be of the essence for protection of public health and property.

14.15.020 Key Lock Box System.

- A. The following structures shall be equipped with a key lock box at or near the main entrance or such other location as required by the Fire Chief.
 - 1. Schools, whether public or private.
 - 2. Any building: (a) with a fire detection or suppression system that will cause the City to be notified of an alarm; (b) a general or interconnected fire alarm system; or (c) that has an external audible fire alarm.
 - 3. Any commercial or industrial building that has a common wall(s) between units in the building or a common wall(s) with another building. 14.15.010 Declaration of Purpose.

- A. The City of Whitewater, Wisconsin Common Council hereby determines that the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Whitewater, Wisconsin are promoted and safeguarded by requiring certain structures to have a key lock box installed on the exterior of the structure to aid the ~~City of Whitewater Fire Department Inc.~~ and City of Whitewater Police Department ~~and other City of Whitewater public safety personnel~~ to gain access to the structure when the same is not occupied, when the occupants are unable to grant ingress and for other legal purposes. However, this ordinance shall not grant Whitewater Fire Department Inc. or the City of Whitewater Police Department a greater right to enter into any building than what would be legally allowed without this ordinance.
- B. The key lock box system will reduce the need for forced entry into structures and should avoid costly and time-consuming efforts in gaining access to locked structures during an emergency.
- C. This chapter will provide for a method for rapid response entry into and throughout locked buildings in emergency situations where time may be of the essence for protection of public health and property.

11.16.010 - Parking generally.

When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for longer than the time periods specified in [11.16.031](#) (fifteen-~~(15)~~ minute parking); [11.16.065](#) (thirty-~~(30)~~ minute parking), and 11.16.070 (two-~~(2)~~ hour parking). Unless otherwise stated in the table set forth in [Section 11.16.150](#), these parking time limitations shall only apply on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday from eight~~(8:00)~~ a.m. until five ~~(5:00)~~ p.m., and shall not apply on Sundays and legal holidays.



Re: Summary/Narrative of 2nd Quarter 2016

Attached is a summary report which compares the 2nd quarter 2016 with the 2nd quarter of 2015. I included the general fund, water, wastewater, & stormwater utility. Most of the narrative will be spent on major revenue /expense items in the general fund.

Overview: The general fund has shown considerable improvement in both revenues and reduction in expenditures overall with the utility funds remaining stable when compared to the 2nd quarter of 2015.

Comments:

General Fund-100: Revenues

Taxes:

The local tax collection is approximately 100k more than at the same time last year. Final settlements will be received from the counties on August 15. The total tax levy is \$72,041 higher for 2016. The total is \$3,143,775.

Intergovernmental Revenues:

MOU-Dispatch Services-University-agreement was paid in June for \$177,006. The University MOU covers 1/3 of the operational cost of the Dispatch operation. The payment for 2015 was booked in August for the 3rd quarter of 2015. The 2015 amount was \$169,553.

University-lease-Parking- of \$40,000-is due in August.

Licenses & Permits:

Higher by \$12,647 primarily due to a \$6,127 increase in building/zoning permits issued. Plus \$4,171 more in liquor & beer licenses. Also electrical, plumbing, & HVAC permit revenues are higher.

Fines & Forfeitures:

Ordinance Violations are higher by \$14,705 when compared to 2015. The amounts collected for 2016 is higher due to all unpaid citations being placed with the State of Wisconsin Debt Collection Service.

Parking Violations-\$4,287 lower than 2015. The 2015 amount is at the anticipated % of budget— 50.7%

Public Charges for Services:

Ambulance-\$64,551(27.4%) higher than 2015. Total of \$300,266. Slightly higher the projected budget %----53.6% vs 50.0%

Budget for 2016 is \$560,000.

Overall, public charges for services are higher for 2016 by \$63,746.

Miscellaneous Revenues:

Interest Income is \$9,215 higher than at the same time last year. Interest rates on time deposits have risen from .06 to .42 over the last 8 months.

Other Financing Sources:

Significantly higher due to the 27th payroll transfer to the general fund for 2016 of \$160,000. This is as expected and budgeted.

General Fund-100: Expenditures

Legislative: Lower (\$7,227) than at the same time last year. 39.8% of the budget has been spent.

Contingencies: \$29,941.27-includes \$27,941.27 for the conversion of a portion of the municipal buildings basement into sleeping quarters for the fire/rescue personal. \$2,000 is for the support of the Discover Whitewater Series-Half Marathon, 5k, Fit Kid Shuffle.

General Administration: Tracking with budget @ 50.3%. Higher than 2015 primarily due to the election inspector payroll expenses. This was expected and budgeted accordingly. Assessor services is \$4500 higher than budgeted.

Information Technology: \$1,276 higher. On track with the budget-53.4%.

Financial Administration: \$1,262 higher than 2015. On track with the budget-50.7%.

Facilities Maintenance-\$1,356 higher. On track with the budget-47.4%.

Police Administration, Police Patrol, Police Investigation, and Community Service Program (CSO): In total, the Police function is \$1,227 higher than at the same time last year. During the last 12 months, the Police department has implicated a major reorganization of the department. All individual functions are under the mid-year budget %'s. NOTE: On July 1, sworn officers received a 1.5% wage increase and they fully participate at the general workers % in the Wisconsin Retirement System (WRS). With this the agreed to union contract has been fully implemented.

Fire Department, Crash Crew, & Rescue Services: \$52,270 more than at the same time in 2015. The fire department has filed to be a 501c3 organization. The general fund is making payments to cover expenses. No agreement has been reached between the parties. Thru June, 55.42% of the fire department budget has been spent. NOTE: As of April 1, a new trust & agency fund—850 has been established to account for all fire department assets/liabilities/revenues/expenses.

Neighborhood Services: \$27,585 lower primarily due to lower GIS expenses (\$9,549); Other Professional Services (\$18,894); Operating Supplies (\$3,303).

Communication/Dispatch: \$19,323 lower than 2015. Due to the expected expense for radio services has not been received. The expected amount is \$19,350. All other expenses are as expected.

Shop/Fleet Operations: \$11,136 lower. No individual item accounts for the difference. Combination of several line items contribute to the overall lower expenditures.

Park Maintenance: \$19,311 higher than 2015. Salaries/wages are higher by \$8,955. Seasonal wages are lower by \$3,257. Health insurance is higher by \$4,029; Professional Development is \$2,631 higher and tree/landscaping is \$10,819 higher. Overall the Parks Maintenance is tracking with the budget @ 51.0%.

Street Maintenance: \$36,130 lower. Due to lower traffic control supplies expenses of \$10,669; lower material/repairs-\$12,563; lower temporary payroll-\$5,002; lower Bridge/Dam expenses-\$2,122. Overall the street maintenance function has spent 43.8% of their budget.

Snow & Ice: \$62,212 lower than at the same time last year. Wages/salaries- \$9,829 lower; snow equipment repair is \$5,532 lower; salt & sand-\$45,108 lower. Overall, 48.3% of the budget has been spent.

Street Lights: \$20,252 lower. Due to lower electricity cost plus the June billing was not paid until July business. The street light expenses are tracking with the budget.

Young Library Building-\$3,492 lower. Wages-\$2,757 lower. Only 32.5% of the budget has been spent.

Park Administration: \$907 higher. 41.3% of the budget has been spent.

Recreation Administration: \$6,750 lower. Health insurance expense is \$4,007 lower. Overall, 38.8% of the budget has been spent.

Recreation Programs: \$5,519 lower due to a lower payroll expenses of \$4,525.

Senior Citizen's Program: \$691 lower. Tracking with the budget at 47.4%.

Transfer to Other Funds: \$60,430 lower. Transfers are only made when necessary. All budgeted transfers will be made by the end of 2016.

Transfer to Debt Service: \$17,321 lower due to timing of transfers. The remaining transfer of \$494,263 will be made by the end of the year for 2016.

Water Utility:

Revenues- Industrial Sales-\$75,924 higher. The LSP power plant being shut down & off-line from May 2 thru June 14, 2015. This was for a major scheduled maintenance on the natural gas turbine. The roof had to be removed in order to perform the maintenance. Residential revenues are \$3,356 higher. In total, water sales are \$83,754 higher. The last rate increase was effective in June 2014, water rates were increased by 3%-SRC.

Expenses-as expected and budgeted. Total expenses are \$502,746 higher due to the George Street & Center Street Reconstruction projects. Both projects are expected to be completed by September 1.

Wastewater Utility:

Revenues: Metered sales are \$544,535 higher. This is due to the Clean Water Fund project of \$24,357,638 that started in March 2016 at the wastewater plant. Rates were adjusted on December 29, 2015 in order to meet the debt service requirements of the CWF loan. The average residential increase was 39.9%. Sewer connection revenues- \$20,064 higher; Residential revenues-\$228,419 higher; Public revenues-\$121,517 higher; Industrial revenues- \$15,386 higher; Commercial revenues- \$179,217 higher.

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Expenses:

As expected and budgeted for 2016. Major projects are George Street and Center Street Reconstruction projects. Both projects are expected to be completed by September 1. The CWF project at the wastewater plant is expected to be an 18 month construction project. Completion should be in the fall of 2017.

Stormwater Utility:

Revenues-higher (\$23,962) due to rate increase that went into effect on December 29, 2015.. This rate adjustment was necessary to cover the debt service for the George Street & Center Street Reconstruction projects.

Expenses:

Administrative/General Expenses: \$7,487 higher due to payroll related expenses.

Street Cleaning Expenses: \$8,130 higher due to street cleaning equipment parts/repairs-\$10,125.

Stormwater Management: \$265,510 higher due to George Street reconstruction-\$23,332; Center Street reconstruction-\$176,776; Ann Street Detention Basin-\$41,214; TMDL Plan-\$13,676.

Miscellaneous Items:

Investments:

Held by the three local banks-Commercial, Associated, and First Citizens. Interest rates range from .28% to .42% for daily operating funds to .45% to .60% for cd's depending on the length of the term.

SUMMARY OF ITEM BEING PRESENTED: A project identified in the capital planning document for the Aquatic Center was the replacement of carpet. The carpet is original to the facility (2001) and is showing very visible signs of wear and deterioration. In addition, the sections of “sea-green” vinyl at locker room entrances and door entrances will be removed and replaced with carpeting at the recommendation of both companies we met with. All carpet installed will be square “carpet tiles” that can be replaced when worn or damaged.

Proposals were received from 2 companies and staff is recommending 26oz proposal supplied by Strand’s on the Floor. The 15oz carpet will show wear and damage much sooner than the more resilient 26oz product. A summary of proposals received is below:
