Smith-Allen House

445 W. Center St.

An Italian Villa style home of cream brick, which features a three story tower, round arched windows and an elaborate entrance.





Engebretsen/ Dorr House

622 W. Main St.

A lavish, Queen Anne style house covered with narrow clapboards and decorated with scalloped, square, and diamond shingles.



Newton M. Littlejohn House

429 W. Main St.



An Italianate style home with an elaborate bay window, oculus windows and built with cream city brick.



G.W. Esterly House

604 W. Main St.



A late Italianate home of cream brick has cornices, saw tooth moldings, decorative bay windows and round arched openings.





Esterly Carriage House

122 N. Esterly Ave.

Remodeled in 1919, this carriage house was built to match the main house. It has wide eaves with gable end returns.



Nelson Salisbury House

404 North St.



An Italianate style house with a massive cornice. The windows are decorated with pedimented stone hood molds.





F. J. Starin Mansion

138 N. Fremont St.

Remodeled in 1878, a large mansard roof was added to the third story to provide space for a fourth floor ballroom.




Whitewater Passenger Depot

310 W. Whitewater St.



This vermillion colored brick building has rough-finished limestone accents, a wide platform overhang supported by massive knee-brace brackets, and an unusual parapet with Gothic pinnacles and Queen Anne details.





Birge Fountain

402 W Main St.

This fountain is 17.5 feet high with two catch basins which collect water flowing from the “Maid of the Mist” and four cherubs riding on dolphins.



Lyman Wight Octagon House

127 N. Newcomb St.



Octagon houses are quiet rare and this one and this one is of special note due to its small size. It is a frame structure with wide overhanging eaves, a carved frieze, and brackets. >>


J. J. Starin House

507 W. Main St.



Remodeled in 1912 and 1924, this house is a large, two story cream brick structure with Greek Revival features.





Bassett House

708 W Main St.

This Italianate style house features a bracketed frieze, bay window and sulpted roof.



First United Methodist Church

145 S. Prairie St..



A Gothic Revival Church featuring a steeply pitched gable roof of fan-vaulted construction and large buttresses.



Hamilton House

328 W. Main St.



Remodeled in 1881 and 1887, this house is an example of Second Empire architecture decorated in a Queen Anne style.



Sanger Marsh House

522 W. Main St.



An early Italianate, this home's low pitched, hip roof is topped with metal cresting along with wide eaves and beautiful porches.





White Memorial Library


402 W Main St.

This building is built in a Neo-classical Revival style.



Whitewater Effigy Mounds Preserve

228 S Indian Mound Pkwy.



Known as the Maples Mound Group, this preserve contains 13 conical, linear and effigy mounds in the shapes of birds, panthers, turtles and mink.



Hotel Walworth

204 W Main St.



Now known as the Landmark Hotel, this 3 story Queen Anne style commercial building is composed of cream brick upon a raised, limestone foundation.



Kiernan Yasko House

136 Whiton St.



This building was designated as a landmark due to its cultural significance as Kiernan's Candy Kitchen during the 1920's.
