- Waste antifreeze & motor oil.
- Vehicle batteries
- Other agricultural chemicals including: unusable animal medications and vaccines, teat wash, solvents, degreasers, rodent baits, paint additives, lead-based paints, etc.

Unacceptable Materials:


- Empty agricultural chemical containers
- Infectious or biological wastes
- Compressed gas cylinders
- Explosives, radioactive waste
- Freon
- Tires, latex paint
- Computers/Electronic Equipment
- Human Pharmaceuticals
